

At first I didn't know what you meant by No-Plug-n-Play but did a search and saw reference to a "show hidden devices" setting. Nothing on the list is marked.-

I have not found this to be true but my wife has had it go BSOD when clicking on FB. For me, no logic. Surfing, FB, Print, but I don't think it has happened while on an email (yet).

As far as Event Viewer goes, nothing in the subcategories of Summary of Admin Events correlates with the exact BSOD time. In fact, every entry was at least either 3 mins before or 3 mins after (reboot).

ERROR has something a little before and something a little after (see below). All of the Error entries are Kernel-Event-Tracing.

At 3 Mins BEFORE BSOD says twice and one second apart:

Event 11 Disc: "The driver detected a controller error on \Device\Harddisk4\DR4"

at 3 Mins AFTER BSOD says:

Kernel-Tracing-Event: "Session "Microsoft Security Client OOBE" stopped due to the following error: 0xC000000D", followed by

Event 6008, Event Log: "The previous system shutdown at 12:41:43 PM on 9/22/2019 was unexpected."

INFORMATION. All entries say:

"The description for Event ID 0 from source igfxCUIService 1.0.0.0 cannot be found. Either the component that raises this event is not installed on your local computer or the installation is corrupted. You can install or repair the component on the local computer."

CRITICAL. All entries say KERNEL-POWER and apparently mark the reboot after a crash. It says:

"The system has rebooted without cleanly shutting down first. This error could be caused if the system stopped responding, crashed, or lost power unexpectedly."

WARNING. Has one entry a few minutes after the BSOD and says:

"The driver \Driver\WUDFRd failed to load for the device
